



Infringement Policy

Ulfberht responds to notices of copyright infringement in accord with the Digital Millennium Copyright Act (“DMCA”) and uses a similar process for trademark infringement claims.

Copyright

ONLY COPYRIGHT OWNERS CAN REPORT A SUSPECTED INFRINGEMENT TO US. IF YOU ARE NOT THE COPYRIGHT OWNER (OR THE AUTHORIZED REPRESENTATIVE OF THE OWNER) YOU CANNOT REPORT A SUSPECTED INFRINGEMENT TO US. IF YOU BELIEVE THAT ANY CONTENT ON A WEBSITE INFRINGES ANOTHER PARTY’S COPYRIGHT, YOU SHOULD ADVISE THE COPYRIGHT OWNER DIRECTLY. PLEASE NOTE THAT YOU MAY BE LIABLE FOR DAMAGES, INCLUDING COURT COSTS AND ATTORNEYS FEES, IF YOU MATERIALLY MISREPRESENT THAT CONTENT ON A WEBSITE IS COPYRIGHT INFRINGING. WHEN IN DOUBT, YOU SHOULD CONSULT AN ATTORNEY. IN ANY EVENT, IF YOU BELIEVE YOUR COPYRIGHTS ARE BEING INFRINGED, WE STRONGLY URGE YOU TO CONTACT THE USER DIRECTLY.

To notify Ulfberht of copyright infringement, please send a written notice by mail that includes all of the following:

1. Your name, mailing address, telephone number and email address.
2. Identification of the copyrighted work with sufficient detail;
3. The specific location within our services that contains the material that you claim infringes your copyright;
4. A statement by you that you have a good faith belief that the disputed use is not authorized by the copyright owner, its agent, or the law (i.e. “I have a good faith belief that use of the copyrighted materials described above as allegedly infringing is not authorized by the copyright owner, its agent, or the law.”);
5. A statement by you that the information contained in your notice is accurate and that you attest under the penalty of perjury that you are the copyright owner or that you are authorized to act on the copyright owner's behalf (i.e. “I swear, under penalty of perjury, that the information in the notification is accurate and that I am the copyright owner or am authorized to act on behalf of the owner of an exclusive right that is allegedly infringed.”).
6. An electronic or physical signature of the owner of the copyright or a person authorized to act on the owner's behalf.



Upon receipt of notices that meet the above requirements, Ulfberht will remove or disable the allegedly infringing content, regardless of the nature of the copyright (for example, a therapy, a template, or content contained in a therapy or template). We will document those alleged infringements on which we act. Also, we will notify the user and, if requested, provide the report to the user. Please note that in addition to being forwarded to the user who provided the allegedly infringing content, a copy of this legal notice (with your personal information removed) may be sent to a third-party that may publish and/or annotate it. We may terminate or exclude access to our services for egregious or repeat infringers.

If a user of our websites believes that their content was removed or disabled by mistake or misidentification, the user can send us a written counter-notice that includes all of the following:

1. The user's name, mailing address, telephone number and email address.
2. Identification of the material that has been removed or disabled and the specific location on our services at which the material appeared before it was removed or disabled.
3. A statement that the user consents to the jurisdiction of the Federal District Court in which the user's address is located, or Minneapolis, MN if the user's address is outside the United States.
4. A statement under penalty of perjury that the user has a good faith belief that the material in question was removed or disabled as a result of mistake or misidentification of the material to be removed or disabled (i.e. "I swear, under penalty of perjury, that I have a good faith belief that each item of content identified above was removed or disabled as a result of a mistake or misidentification of the material to be removed or disabled, or that the material identified by the complainant has been removed or disabled at the specific location and will no longer be shown.")
5. The user's physical or electronic signature.

Ulfberht will restore the removed or disabled content following 10 business days from the date that we received a proper written counter-notice, unless our copyright agent first receives notice that a court action has been filed to restrain the user from engaging in infringing activity related to the removed or disabled content.

Trademark

To notify Ulfberht of trademark infringement, please send a written notice by mail that includes all of the following:



1. Your name, mailing address, telephone number and email address.
2. Identification of the trademarked work with sufficient detail including the serial or registration number of the trademark if it has been registered;
3. The specific location within our services that contains the material that you claim infringes your trademark;
4. A statement by you that you have a good faith belief that the disputed use is not authorized by the trademark owner, its agent, or the law (i.e. "I have a good faith belief that use of the trademarked materials described above as allegedly infringing is not authorized by the trademark owner, its agent, or the law.");
5. A statement by you that the information contained in your notice is accurate and that you attest under the penalty of perjury that you are the trademark owner or that you are authorized to act on the trademark owner's behalf (i.e. "I swear, under penalty of perjury, that the information in the notification is accurate and that I am the trademark owner or am authorized to act on behalf of the owner of an exclusive right that is allegedly infringed.");
6. An electronic or physical signature of the owner of the trademark or a person authorized to act on the owner's behalf.

Upon receipt of notices that meet the above requirements, Ulfberht will remove or disable the allegedly infringing content, regardless of the nature of the trademark (for example, a therapy, a template, or content contained in a therapy or template). We will document those alleged infringements on which we act. Also, we will notify the user and, if requested, provide the report to the user.
